

## School Sport Premium Funding and Impact for 2019 - 2020 Academic Year.

In 2017, the Government announced that funding for Physical Education (PE) would double to £320 million. We are thankful that they have continued this funding through this academic year and for next (2020-2021).

It is intended that the funding be used to **improve the quality of PE and sport provision** in all state schools. In accordance with the government guidance, we will be feeding it directly into developing the provision of sport and PE throughout the school. The amount awarded is £16,000 together with an additional £10 per pupil. This means that our total income from Sports Premium funding was £18,200.

Sports participation at Grove Junior School will be so much more than just PE lessons, with every child in KS2 having the opportunity, resources and guidance to be the very best they can be.

### **Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium**

**ALL** pupils leaving Grove will be **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

The **aims** for the investment at Grove Junior School are:

- To increase the breadth and quality of the PE curriculum in all classes - giving a broader experience and greater range of activities.
- To increase the opportunities for children to be engaged in a guided physical activity at lunchtime.
- To invest in sustainable practice that will have a lasting impact - to make improvements that will benefit pupils joining the school in the future.
- To increase the opportunities for **all** pupils to compete in sports within school.
- To give all Year 6 children to opportunity to represent our school in inter-school sporting events.
- Achieve the 'Gold' award for our School Games application.
- Encourage healthy lifestyles and ensure that pupils are given the opportunity to be physically literate.

The **funding** has been used in the following ways (Sept 2019 - July 2020):

- £5165 has been used to employ Premier Sports during lunchtime to offer a broader range of physical activities for **all** children.
- £1997.50 has been used to provide all children of Key Workers and Vulnerable families sporting provision throughout their time at school during the COVID-19 pandemic (this provision was provided by Premier Sports).
- £1200 has been used to join a local sports partnership (North Somerset Schools PE association), which provides support, training, resourcing and access to level 2 and 3 inter school competitions. This also enables access to PE enrichment days, where children have had access to different physical activities and sports.
- £800 has been used to fund a range of specialist sports coaches to facilitate engagement in a variety of different activities including, Netball for Year 6, Athletics for Years 3 and 4.
- £664.78 has been spent on new equipment and maintenance of equipment we already have to ensure quality resources are available for PE lessons.
- £175 has been spent on a new scheme of work to allow teachers to deliver high-quality lessons.

The **impact** of the funding will be measured by:

- Pupil perception conferencing measuring the interest of children in different areas of the PE curriculum and their engagement of them in regular activity, kick-starting a healthy lifestyle.
- An increase in the number of children engaging in intra and inter-school sporting activities.
- The number of children attending a sports club either in school (lunchtimes or after schools clubs) or outside school.
- the increased number of sports / activities on offer to the children during PE lessons, lunchtime and interschool sporting events.
- the up skilling of staff members through observations and schemes of work.

The **outcomes** are as follows:

- The school has bought a new scheme of work (Power of PE) to allow staff and children to develop skills across a wide range of sports.
- On average, 120 children engaged in the Premier Sport Stay Active lunchtime sessions each week.
- 50% of our Year 6 cohort represented our school in inter-school competitions (Due to COVID-19 we were unable to attend NSSPEA events during Terms 5 and 6).
- School Games award was cancelled due to COVID-19, as all NSSPEA for Terms 5 and 6 were cancelled.
- All children of Key Workers and Vulnerable families were provided with an hour of exercise per day, delivered by Premier Sports. When Years Reception, 1 and 6 returned, all children were provided with an hour per week. This provision was delivered over the course of the COVID-19 Pandemic.
