Pupil Premium

Dear Parents and carers,

At The Whiteoak Academies we want to make sure that we are providing your child with the best education and support we can. For those of you that do not know what Pupil Premium involves and what this could mean for your child I have answered some commonly asked questions below.

What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium is a grant, also referred to as ‘Free School Meals’, received by schools from the Government to improve the attainment of some of our children. This funding helps the school to support pupils to achieve their best socially and academically. One of the benefits to children that are eligible is that they receive a free school meal as healthy eating and having a hot school meal is linked to being learning ready, but this is just one of many! What some parents are unaware of is that not only do the children receive a free school meal but they also gain access to a grant that can fund additional support for academic and social activities in school. This grant needs to be applied for by families but as a result of all children from Reception to Year 2 receiving a free hot school meal, or because some parents do not want their child to take up the free school meal, some parents are discouraged from making this application despite the additional benefits that their child may receive.

How do I know if I am eligible?

Your child's school may be entitled to Pupil Premium/ Free School Meals if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit Only (with income up to £16,190) with no element of Working Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support
- Guarantee Element of the State Pension Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance (income related)
- Universal Credit (income dependant)

At this stage, we would encourage **everyone** to apply, especially because many families’ financial situations have changed because of the recent COVID pandemic. – You might be surprised!

How do I apply for Pupil Premium Funding?

There are several ways to apply. You can complete a form online by clicking [here](#). If you have more than one child, you will need to complete the form again, one for each child. But please do not be put off! It only takes 5 minutes per application and could save you £100s over the time that your children are at school with us. It might surprise you to know that you can also apply for Pupil Premium by contacting the school directly. I am offering appointments over the phone, this month, to complete the application form with you. The whole process takes 5 minutes and you get an instant answer. If you have any questions regarding the application process or you would like to make an appointment for me to complete the form with you over the phone please do get in touch.

What support can we as a school offer?

- Children are all supported in ensuring they receive Quality First Teaching – through staff CPD and curriculum development opportunities.
- Children could be given opportunities to take part in afterschool clubs where appropriate.
- KS2 children have the opportunity to receive music tuition e.g. guitar and keyboard.
- Priority is given to enrichment opportunities e.g. school trips, classroom visitors etc...
- Additional support for social and emotional needs, and academic progress through interventions from our support staff or teachers or outside agencies with agreement from the school.

What is the role of the Inclusion Lead in relation to Pupil Premium?

I am a point of contact for our children, parents and staff. As part of my role, I will be looking at whole school enrichment opportunities and supporting staff to ensure our children are given every opportunity to succeed both in and outside of the classroom. I will monitor the impact of any interventions put into place for individuals and groups, ensuring we meet the needs of our children to the best of our ability.
