Physical Geography


Deserts have an extreme climate. Hot deserts reach temperatures of $50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ in the daytime but fall to $0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ once the sun sets.

## Where?

Most hot deserts are found between $15-30^{\circ}$ North and South of the Equator.

People who live in deserts are mostly nomads. They have to adapt to survive the extreme climate.
