#### **Raw Scores**

Children are given a raw score out of the total number of marks available for each test:

**SPAG: out of 70** (combined over 2 papers)

**English Reading: out of 50** 

Maths: out of 110 (combined over 3 papers)



#### **Scaled Scores**

<u>Scaled scores</u> work on a basis of a scale of 80 to 120 which fluctuates slightly each year depending on the difficulty of the test. This is decided by the DfE prior to the tests being delivered.

As the tests are of a similar standard each year, but questions differ, the government use a scaled score to also track attainment over time. They then calculate a national average from this.


Class teachers will share the results with the children privately in July. You will then receive your child's results in their end of year reports.


We receive the results a few weeks prior to this to allow time to contest any papers etc.

This information also goes up to their secondary schools which they can use to guide sets, particularly in Maths. However, children are usually tested in the first few weeks of Year 7.
