

Once again may I say a big thank you to those of you that have supported our Curriculum Enrichment fund as this really does help to enhance the work we are able to do across our family of schools.

Speech & Language Resource Base

This week, the Department for Education granted permission for the development of the Speech & Language Resource Base on our school site. The Resource Base will support North Somerset's Local SEND offer and be a purpose-built provision on the front playground of the Grove side of school. https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/uk-england-somerset-66776120

As a result of this project, the climbing equipment that is currently there will be moved to the Junior playground at the back of school, helping to create an extended play area, with the cabins due to be demolished and removed during this half term.

The new build will be a modular construction and is due to start at Easter. The provision will be for up to 12 children with an Educational, Health & Care Plan whose primary need is Speech & Language. Resource Bases are usually attached to and are part of a mainstream school setting so that those children identified as benefitting from this provision. This facilitates a blended learning program that will allow some access to a mainstream curriculum and classroom as well as the main provision of targeted support within the Resource Base.


All children attending a Resource Base will have an Education Health & Care Plan (EHCP), and access will be managed by the Local Authority as part of the statutory EHCP pathway and school consultation with the mainstream school. Where a school responds positively to a consultation and a placement is agreed, the Local Authority will name the mainstream school as the chosen setting for the child.

Similar provision in the South West already exists at Castle Batch Primary School in Weston-super-Mare and Charborough Road Primary School in Bristol.
